1992 National Unicycle Meet - Selected Rules

Age Groups: *0-6, 7-8, 9-10, 11-12, 13-14, 15-16, 17-18, 19-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50 & up

Final age categories will be at the discretion of the Meet Director depending on registrations.

Competitive Categories: Junior Expert, Expert
We are adding "Junior Expert" category to both racing and artistic riding (freestyle). There will be separate events for boys and girls ages 0-14 in this category. This grouping is designed to recognize exceptional young riders who may not have achieved "expert" status as yet.
Points to be awarded: 1st place (8), 2nd - (6), 3rd - (4), 4th - (2), 5th - (1)

STANDARD ARTISTIC riding has been changed significantly. The new age groups for this event are * 0-12, 13-18, 19 up In addition each of these age groups is divided up into 4 categories. Each of these categories contains certain basic skills that must be performed by the rider:

- Category I: Mount, circle to the left & right, dismount
- Category II: Side mount, figure "8", idling 5 times with each foot, ride backward in a circle
- Category III: Kick-up mount, seat in front in a circle, one-footed in a circle, walk-the-wheel 10m
- Category IV: Seat in front backward figure "8", backward one-footed in a circle, walk-the-wheel one-footed in a circle, pirouette

Time limit this event: 2 mins (I & II), 3 mins (III & IV)

INDIVIDUAL FREESTYLE riding will have a single age category for *30 and up. Time limit this event: 0-14 (except Jr.Expert) 2 minutes; 15 and up 3 minutes.

FREESTYLE will have same competitive categories as individual freestyle. Age of older rider is age group of the pair. "Expert" is the oldest category; "Jr. Expert" is the second oldest. Time limit: same as Ind. Freestyle

CLUB SHOW will be limited to a maximum time of 6 minutes and a minimum of 5 riders. Club routines must include ALL riding club members present that are registered for the meet. Clubs must be registered by the USA, Inc.

GROUP FREESTYLE has a maximum time of 3 minutes and a minimum of 3 riders. Each club may select only one group of its riders to participate in this event. Non-club riders may participate in one group only.

RACING TEAMS will be made up of a maximum of 10 riders. Clubs wishing to enter this competition will use their top ten riders (point totals) in the racing events. A club may enter a second group of 10 riders if they wish. Rider's points may count for only one team. Non-club riders may also form racing teams. "Points" races will include both the fast and slow "backward" races. **RIDERS MAY CHOOSE ONLY ONE OF THESE AND REGISTER IN ADVANCE.**

Other "points" races are: long (1600m, 800m, 400m) [1600m races are for ages 11 and up, 400m races are for 30 and up. Riders may choose only one long race.], 200m, 100m, 50m one-foot, wheel walk, slow forward, and current standard obstacle course.

This abbreviated set of rules will alert participants to major changes planned for the 1992 NUM. The complete set of 1992 National Unicycle Meet rules will be sent to club directors in the near future. For a complete set of USA, Inc. rules see page 6 of UNICYCLING in this issue.

**WALTER NILSSON'S RIDE:
YOU'D BETTER BELIEVE IT!**

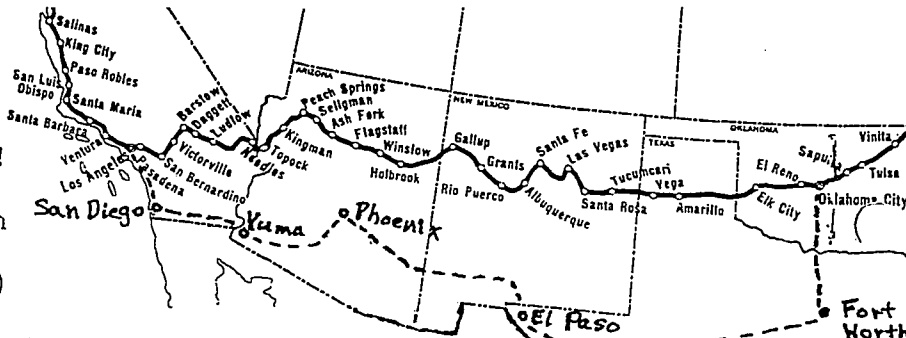
Intrigued by the discrepancies in reports of Walter Nilsson's age at the time of his transcontinental unicycle ride, the year of the trip, the number of miles traversed, and the place of completion (San Francisco as in the bet with Charles Johnston or San Diego as per American Bicyclist) in 117 days, I decided in August 1991 to make further inquiries.

I spoke with the late Alvin Drysdale's son Thomas in New Jersey, who has no information as to whether his father and Tom Simmons built an 8' unicycle specifically for Nilsson's ride; or when, if at all, they built one for him.

A search for Ripley's museums in the directory of American museums was fruitless until a helpful reference librarian remembered one in Canada. I eventually reached Edward Meyer, a curator at Ripley's headquarters in Toronto. When I mentioned "unicyclist," he immediately responded, "Nilsson," and checked their files of one letter; two news clippings; one photo (the one which I also have); the Benagh article and drawing; Nilsson cartoons issued in 1934, 1954, 1989, and 1990; and a 1983 Newsday interview with JeanPaul Jenack which mentions Nilsson's ride. Because of a postal strike in Canada, these items were FAXed to me from Toronto on September 3, 1991.

After his review of these items, Meyer concluded that though Walter Nilsson had been featured in four Ripley's cartoons (one of which Dr. Rogers had seen on Nilsson's bike shop wall), he had never won the annual Ripley's contest nor had the Ripley organization sponsored nor even monitored Nilsson's cross-country ride.

Three items help establish the facts. One is an undated, hand-written letter to Mr. Ripley from Lillian Sohmer (8) of Bronx, New York, bringing to his attention the fact that Nilsson had ridden from coast to coast (George Washington Bridge in New York City to San Diego) 3,386 miles "including detours" in 117 days. The cities mentioned in the letter indicate that he departed from his projected

route at Oklahoma City, going south to Fort Worth and then west to El Paso, Phoenix, Yuma, and San Diego instead of to the higher altitude area of Santa Fe, Gallup, and Flagstaff, and on to Los Angeles.

A clipping (9) from an unnamed Yuma, AZ newspaper which Ripley's has dated "2-24-34" states that Nilsson was scheduled to pass through Yuma that day, the 112th day of his trip, according to Lillian Sohmer, "driver of the advance car." He had been averaging 33 miles per day since leaving Fort Worth. Part of this clipping is the photo of Nilsson riding the horn-equipped unicycle, with a field and a row of trees in the background. The well-dressed rider was attired in slacks, a dress shirt and tie, and leather oxfords.

Another clipping (10) is from a San Diego paper, saying that Nilsson had arrived in that city in a downpour on the 117th day of his trip on his 8' unicycle, had visited a relative, and had departed for San Francisco on the last lap of his sojourn to collect on a bet made in Pisa "last August" (i.e., August, 1933).

The route north through California appears to be US 101 with a present-day mileage of 533 miles from San Diego to San Francisco. If Nilsson had continued to ride 33 miles per day, he would have gotten to San Francisco in about 16 days, completing the total journey in 133 days, thus winning his bet based on a five-month time limit. This schedule would have him leaving New York City on approximately November 5, 1933, arriving in Yuma, AZ on February 24, 1934, arriving in San Diego, CA on March 1, 1934, and completing the trip in San Francisco, CA on or about March 17, 1934. Presumably he chose a winter schedule in order to avoid debilitating summer heat (the southwest deserts and elsewhere. The distance of the total trip would have been about 3,919 miles, plus any additional

detours.

It would be nice to believe JeanPaul Jenack's (11) report that in 1933 Nilsson "rode from New York to San Francisco in 186 (sic.) days to capture the \$10,000 grand prize in Ripley's Believe It or Not contest," but apparently it just wasn't so - and he would have lost the bet with Johnston if he had taken more than five months.

In summary, it appears that Walter Nilsson made his bet in May, 1932 and published his pamphlet with the anticipated route later that year. At age 38 or 39 he started his trip in New York about November 5, 1933, completed it approximately 133 days later (about March 17, 1934) in San Francisco, rode approximately 3,919 miles (3,386 from New York to San Diego), was preceded by a car and trailer which he used for mounting (9), rode a unicycle either 8' or 8 1/2' tall, won his bet with Charles Johnston of an unstated amount of money, and had neither supervision nor reward from Ripley's Believe It or Not!

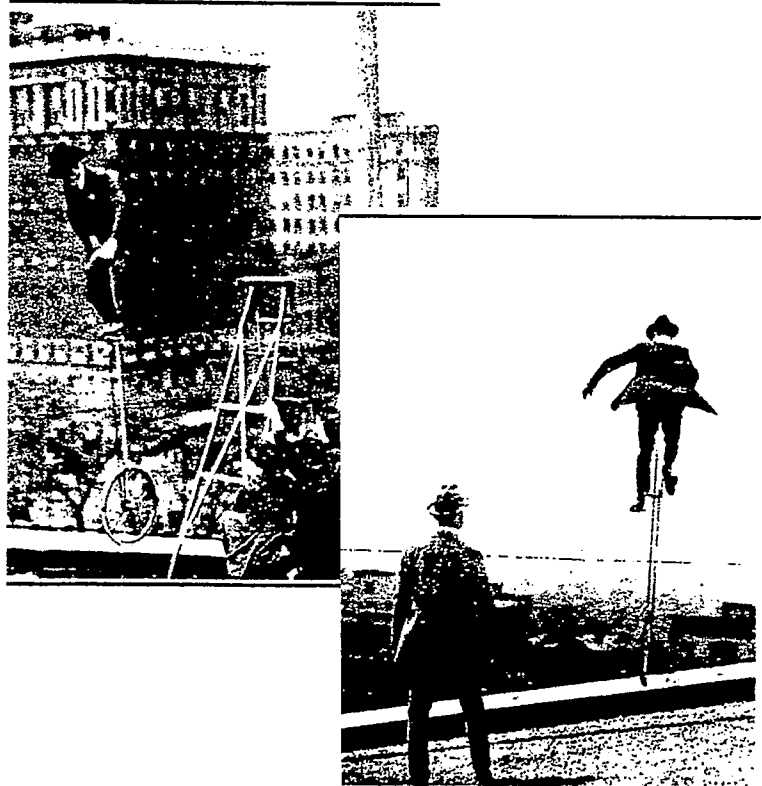
The 1957 Santa Monica (CA) Evening Outlook article (4) by Pierson states that Walter Nilsson was born in Minneapolis and moved with his family to Southern California in 1900. His father was a railroad engineer, which probably explains the "narrow gauge mule." Walter began performing recitations while a child and built a giraffe unicycle, which he rode in shows at about age 11 or 12.

He was in an early movie, spent several decades riding unicycles and trick bicycles in vaudeville, including four seasons on Broadway with "Helzapoppin'," and played on bills with Joe Cook, John Barrymore, Eddie Cantor, Will Rogers, Phil Baker, and the Marx Brothers. He did command performances for Hitler and the King of England, spent years entertaining US troops (4, 12) at home and abroad, and appeared on the Milton Berle, Ed Sullivan, Big Top and Supercircus TV shows.

Nilsson designed and built a motor-driven monocycle (4, 13), built and sold numerous "funny cycles," and collected hundreds of bicycles of all sorts, most of which he sold to other collectors including Henry Ford and Walter Chrysler (4). Anyone who is willing to ride an 8' unicycle on the roof-edges of all buildings (as Nilsson did: see A Strange Wager) is either out of his mind or the world's most skillful - and confident - unicyclist.

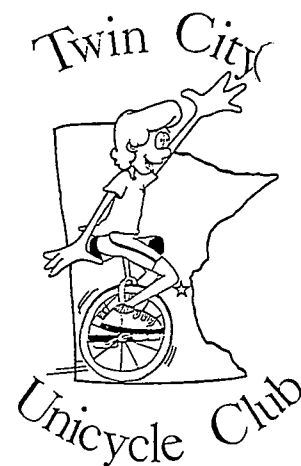

A UNICYCLE WEDDING ON THE HIGH-WIRE

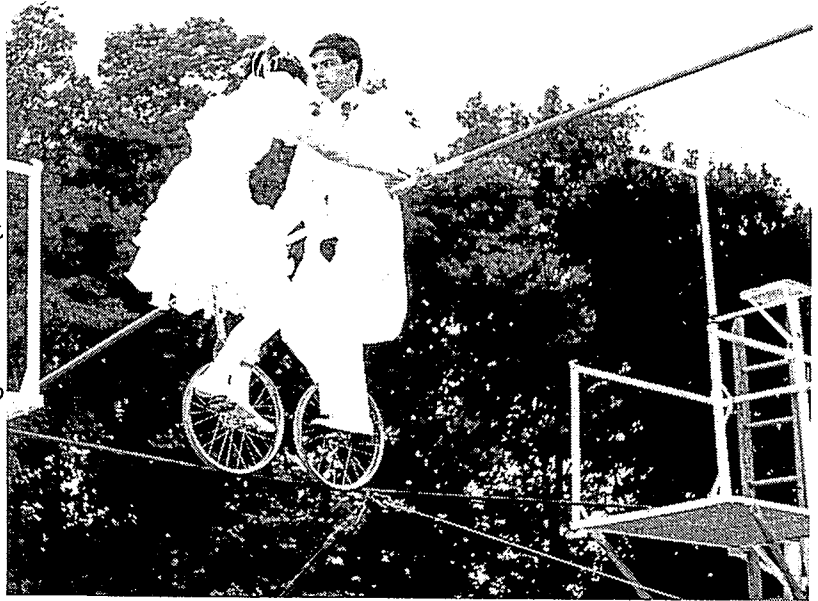

The wedding of Jennifer Savage and Wayne Gaines took place at Tate's Orchard near Peru, Indiana in the evening of Saturday, August 3, 1992. Tate's Orchard was a combination of orchard, farm market, cider press, restaurant and menagerie of geese, chickens, goats, cows and two buffalo calves. The 10- or 12-foot high-wire rigging, chairs for the audience and a large reception tent were set up in a grassy, open field. The weather was nearly ideal for such an outdoor occasion.

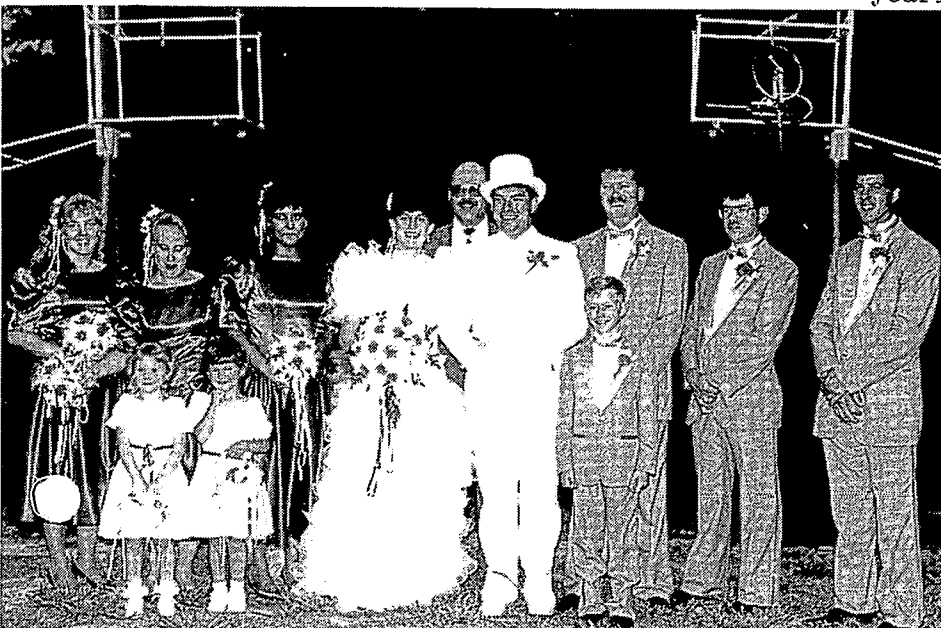
The bride wore a lovely, flouncy, white dress with a long train. The groom, wearing a white tux and medium high hat, was also quite resplendent. The ceremony began on the ground with a preliminary exchange of vows. Then the bride and her attendants performed a bit of magic with zipper or velcro to release her outer skirt and train. The short skirt beneath was more suited to the safe riding of a unicycle. Bride and groom then climbed to opposite ends of the rigging. Wayne unicycled across with a long balance bar to Jennifer, and they both returned to the center. Reverend Bob Clark maneuvered himself into place beside them in the gondola of an apple picker. They then completed their vows, exchanged rings and were pronounced on the wire. Reverend Clark explained that the couple were not doing this just as a publicity stunt but that they had been brought together by a common interest in unicycles and had become a unicycle performing team. This ceremony,

therefore, expressed their relationship and love in a manner unique and meaningful to them. The ceremony was followed by a reception at the tend, and after dark the couple was whisked away in a limousine. In all respects it was a beautiful and memorable event.

Some participants and guests familiar to the unicycling community were Wayne's parents; Wayne's brother, David, and family; Steve and Carol (Wayne's sister) Mills and family - including Anthony, who was only two weeks old at the time and doing fine despite his premature entrance into the outer world. Also present were the Hemmings and the Reynoldses.

After a three year hiatus, UNICON returned, this time to Canada. UNICON V, was originally planned for 1990 with the idea that a UNICON would be held every two years. Though UNICON V was delayed to 1991, UNICON VI will take place on schedule this summer. It hasn't been decided whether the next UNICON will be in 1993 or 1994.

Due to the last minute nature of UNICON V, large numbers of unicyclists who wished to attend were unable to do so. At one point there was a question of whether or not this convention would be an "official IUF Championships". It was eventually agreed that a small UNICON would be much better than no UNICON at all! There will be others, in later years. Though riders from Japan and Europe (except Holland) were missed, the riders present had a great time.

Opening ceremonies were held at the **Maison du Citoyen** (Citizen House) in downtown Hull. This is a beautiful stone and glass building with a four story atrium, in which the ceremony was held. Speeches were made by the mayor of Hull, by **Alberto Ruiz** and by UNICON Host, **Gilles Poirier**.

Races were held at Complexe Sportif Mont-Bleu, on a high quality rubber track. The Marathon race was on a hilly bike path which began at a low elevation and ended back up "on" Mont-Bleu. Gliding and Coasting events were held in a nearby neighborhood with appropriately sloped streets.

Artistic events and basketball took place at "CEGEP de L'Outaouais," a sports center and school next to the track. A bus transported the riders and equipment between these various locations and the dorms at the University of Ottawa. It was odd traveling daily across the Ottawa river, where English is the main language on the Ottawa (Ontario) side, and French is the primary language in Hull (Quebec). This would make the UNICON seem international even for a Canadian!

An informal meeting was held to discuss the IUF's lack of structure, and directions for the future. More about that on *UNICYCLING* page 8.

Notable UNICON performances: In racing two new records were listed in our previous issue. In the 4x100m relay event, three of the fastest teams had problems. The 1st place team from Puerto Rico (José Lopez, José Roman, Javier Ruiz and Candido Santiago), despite a fall, was able to remount and win. The USA team (Andy Cotter, Constance Cotter, James Green and John Foss) had a "problem" with their baton transfer which left America's two overall unicycling champions (Cotter and Foss) sprawled on the track! They came in 3rd. One of the Canadian teams solved his problem (falling just before transferring the baton) by *throwing* it to the next rider! That team was disqualified.

Group Freestyle World Champions **José Roman, Cindy Torres and Anthony Hernandez** did a three person version of the pairs act seen on this issue's cover, culminating in a three-high with Cindy standing on the top!

Pairs World Champions **Brian and Amy Schlosser** (Ohio, USA) had a dance style performance which was low on technical moves and acrobatics, but high on choreography and personality. In 2nd place, the act of **José Roman and Cindy Torres** (see cover) looked like a miniature version of **Sem and Teresa Abrahams'** professional act, but with their own style.

José Roman's peg riding on his 6' giraffe was one of the more interesting new skills displayed. Though the basic skill is not new, José pedaled with both hands instead of one, then swung one foot around to the front to glide on the tire, culminating in a mount, from there, up to the seat!

1991 saw the first artistic performances by Canadians at a UNICON. Though none of the Canadians were winners,

we are likely to see vast improvement in their skill and performance levels at UNICON VI this summer. The best way to get riders in a new country interested in our sport is for them to see it up close and participate!

The Hull/Ottawa area is very cycle-friendly. The main traffic bridge connecting the two cities has three lanes; one each way for cars, and one, equally wide, for pedestrians and unicycles (okay, bicycles too). This made it easy for riders to go from the dorms to the Canadian Museum of Civilization in Hull, or to the Parliament Building, the National Gallery, the restaurant district, or to any of the many sights in the area.

The Closing and Awards Ceremonies were held in a community center near the CEGEP. This building was a true log cabin, made of giant timbers at a cost of over a million dollars. Basketball Champions **The Puerto Rico All Stars** were the first recipients of the **Marc LaSalle Memorial Trophy**. Marc LaSalle was a unicyclist who invited your editor, and others, to his house in 1985 for the annual Uniball tournament in Hull. His death was a tragedy.

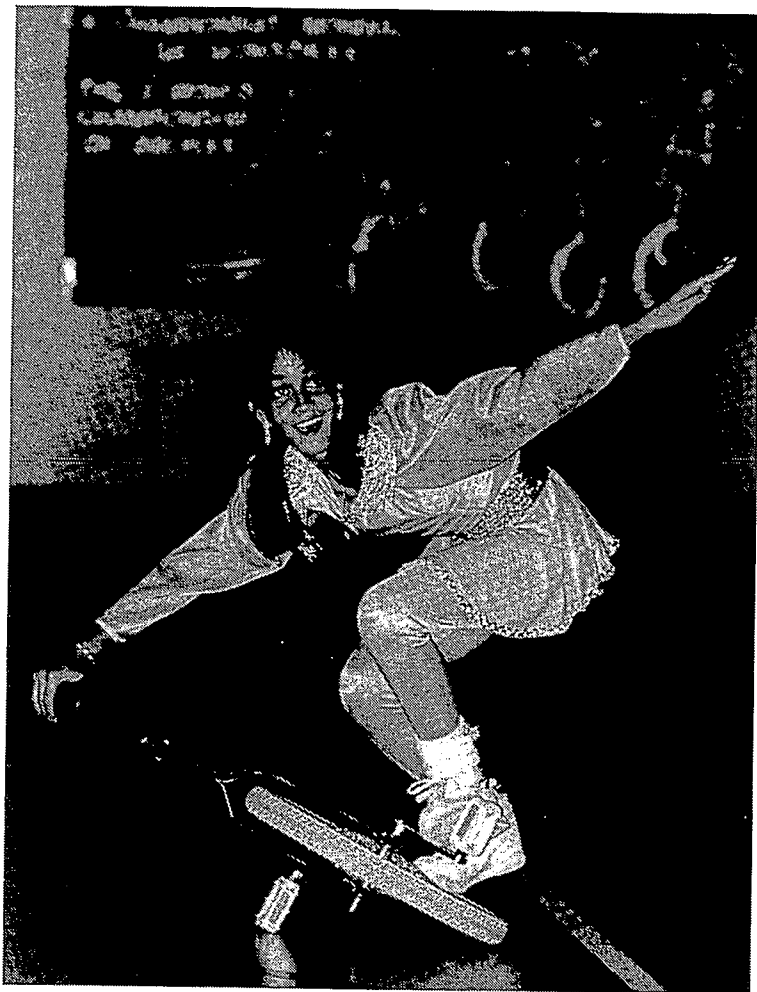
Following the Closing Ceremonies, fireworks were set off, and a giant bonfire was lit outside. Music was played, songs were sung, and those Puerto Rican drums, even after 5 days, were never silent!

Unicycling



The Sixth International Unicycling Championships

Québec City, Canada

August 3-9, 1992

There are no question marks hanging over this unicycle convention; it is for real. Organizers **Normand Beaumont** and **Natalie Noël** have been making preparations since last summer for a large, well organized UNICON. With the early announcements and dates, riders from around the world will be able to make their preparations.

Japanese unicyclists, some of the world's best, were unable to attend last year. This year a very large group is expected, with as many as 100 people! IUF President **Jack Halpern** has also mailed out UNICON information sheets in Korean and Chinese, looking for riders from Korea, China, Hong Kong and other Asian countries.

HEY JUGGLERS! For those of you who prefer the IJA Convention over the NUM, 1992 is the ultimate opportunity for a Canadian vacation. The IJA Festival will be July 20-26 in Montreal, same weekend as the NUM in Minnesota. Take a week to vacation, and arrive for UNICON on August 3 in Québec! For really serious unicyclists; no IJA Festival.

Québec City, capital of the province of Quebec, is about 150 miles northwest of Montreal. Most UNICON activities will be held at the Pavillon de l'éducation physique et des sports (Pepe) of Laval University, "one of the most beautiful universities in Canada". Québec and its surroundings, near the St-Lawrence River, are very beautiful and there are many interesting sites and activities for tourists. Thousands of spectators are expected for this special week.

TRANSPORTATION: Québec Airport is only 20 minutes from the convention site. Busses will be available to pick you up and bring you to Laval University.

ACCOMMODATIONS: 200 dorm rooms have been reserved. They are available for *athletes* at \$10.00 (Canadian) per person per day; two to a room. Rooms will be reserved *upon receipt of paid Registrations*, on a first come, first served basis. For non-competitors, rooms are \$13.00 per person. There are also many hotels nearby, and a list is available. Camping is also available, either on site or at nearby campgrounds.

RULES: NOTE: The new USA Rulebook does not apply to IUF competition. If you ask for it when you register, you will be sent a copy of the competition rules. To obtain the complete booklet of IUF Artistic Rules, write to **Al Hemminger, IUF Inc., 16152 Kinloch, Redford, MI 48240 USA**. There is a small charge - \$10.00 (foreign), \$5.00 (U.S.A.).

EVENTS: The traditional IUF races will be held, plus an Ultimate Wheel Race, Slow Backward, Coasting, Downhill

Gliding, Marathon (8-10km), and UMX (1-2km). There will be no Compulsory Artistic event, but the other artistic events, Standard Skill, Individual Freestyle, Pairs, and Group Freestyle will be run with the same rules as 1991. Of course, there will also be a basketball tournament!

INTERNATIONAL UNICYCLE DAY: This is an event planned for Tuesday, August 4, the day of the Opening Ceremonies. Some special unicycling events may happen on this day.

MONEY: Canadian dollars are less than American dollars, so it will not cost as much as you may think!

USA, Inc. Has New Competition Rulebook

In January, the USA Rules Committee published its long-awaited Official Competition Rulebook. It comes in the form of a 24 page booklet, which contains all rules, plus information to help train racing and artistic officials. These are the official rules for the 1992 National Unicycle Meet. You can obtain a copy by sending \$2.50 to the USA post office box (see order form page). New items for 1992:

CLUBS: To compete as a club, unicycle clubs must become USA Affiliates. This is a new system which is just being set up, so full details will be in the next issue.

RACING: Racers must mount (if they fall) and ride *unassisted*. Riders who receive help will be disqualified.

In points races, riders earn points not only for themselves, but for their club or group (team). The scores of the *10 highest scoring riders* from each team are added up to find the team total. Who those 10 riders will be can only be determined after all races have been run.

ARTISTIC: A new age group; "**Junior Expert**" has been added. It is open to any riders age 0-14, so all the best young riders can compete together, without having to go up against the adults. For the 1992 NUM, Host Jim Bernard is also going to have a Jr. Expert category for racing.

PERFORMING AREAS: Outer boundaries will be marked on the floor. For individuals and pairs, the riding area will be 11x14 meters. For club and group events, the riding area will be 20x30 meters. This is to simulate riding on a stage. Competitors will lose points if they cannot fit their performances within these areas. Part of the judging has to do with how well riders cover the performing area. For larger groups, this will pose a new challenge.

STANDARD ARTISTIC: This is an improvement on the old "Standard Class" category. The judging is the same, but each rider must now also perform four *mandatory* figures (tricks) as part of his/her routine. They may choose the figures for "Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced, or Expert" categories. Each of the four categories will have three age groups: Youth (0-12), Junior (13-18), or Senior (19-UP). This effectively makes 12 age groups. The other artistic events will have the same age groups as used in 1991.

GROUP FREESTYLE: Open to clubs or groups. Minimum 3 riders. 3 minute time limit. No age groups. This bridges the gap between pairs and giant groups. Clubs entering "Club Show" may also enter *one* group into this category under the name of the club.

CLUB SHOW: Open only to USA Affiliate Clubs. Minimum 5 riders. 6 minute time limit. No age groups. Essentially the same as the old "Club Artistic" event.

Proposal for a Special Interest Group for Two
 Wheeled and other Reverse Drive Unicycles

We have seen unicycle comics, unicycle cartoons, even ultra-crude unicycle drawings and cutouts. We have seen the unicycle in advertising, in sculpture, in T-shirts, and even in license plates. What we haven't seen often enough, though, is honest-to-goodness unicycle art!

We would like to feature an example of unicycle art in each issue of *UNICYCLING*. If you send in something really good, it may be on the cover! If you don't send anything, this will be a boring column. It doesn't have to be a masterpiece to be considered art, either.

What is unicycle art? We are looking for illustrations rather than photos (though artistic photos are also welcome); something classy rather than trashy. Cartoons and comics are also welcome, for other parts of our newsletter.

We introduce the Unicycle Art column with a painting by Gitta Bechshøft of Denmark. All of the illustrations, designs and logos you have seen from *Cirkus Changhigh* over the years have been done by her. IUF Director Jean Ascher has sent me several different posters over the years, each of them different. This illustration appeared on a postcard he sent me in December. Its textured appearance is due to the graphic process used to screen it for the newsletter.

With your help, I'd like to do a number of things regarding reverse drive unicycles, particularly two wheeled unicycles:

1: I'd like to find, compile or write as complete a history of reverse drive unicycles as can reasonably be done. Can you please relate to me your experiences with the two wheeler or other reverse drive (RD) unicycles? Please send me references to anything about any RD unicycles published anywhere, or in films, video, etc. Please relate the experiences of others with the two wheeler or any RD unicycle, anywhere in the world.

2: I'd like to compile an address list of all unicyclists who can ride or have a serious interest in RD unicycles. Please send me the names and addresses of people who can ride, or have a serious interest in RD unicycles.

3: I'd like to start a Special Interest Group (SIG) for Reverse Drive Unicyclists (RDU), preferably within the IUF or loosely associated with it. SIGRDU would publish 1 or 2 pages about two wheelers and other RD unicycles within *UNICYCLING*, or separately. SIGRDU would also develop skill levels for riding two wheeled unicycles which could be used in judging two wheeler figures in artistic competitions. If there is enough interest, SIGRDU may even try to establish a two wheeler "Standard" Skill competition within future UNICONS. SIGRDU would demonstrate the inherent difficulty of riding RD unicycles for all unicyclists; the general public in particular. Most importantly, SIGRDU would promote RD unicycles to all unicyclists everywhere.

I will greatly appreciate any help readers can give me with any of the above three goals!

There may be a lot of opposition to a new artistic competition; especially one restricted to two wheelers which only a small percentage of unicyclists can even ride. Of course there should be a separate two wheeler "Standard" Skill competition, since of all variety of unicycles only the two wheeler (RD) distinguishes itself as being truly different from the standard unicycle. Learning to ride a two wheeler is like learning to ride all over again and even worse, riders must *unlearn* old reflexes while learning to ride it. It would be interesting to know how two wheel riders rate the difficulty of riding a two wheeler forward on the IUF Achievement Skill Level List. A number of two wheel riders consider riding the two wheeler forward similar in difficulty to walking the wheel on a standard unicycle. This would give the two wheeler a skill level rating of 6.

1992 is a U.S. Presidential election year (Glad I'm not part of that). This is also an Olympic year (wish we were all part of that!). The first UNICON was also held in an Olympic year, 1984. The true Olympic fan, though they cheer and support the athletes from their own country, hopes the best competitor will win. The IUF Revitalization Committee, under the direction of Ken Fuchs, is starting to re-organize the IUF structure. People working on the committee are expected to put together reports, contact people, and go into action.

John Foss (me) will be in charge of revitalizing the IUF Public Relations Committee. The original purposes of this committee were to do corporate research, to look for potential sponsors, to generate income for the IUF through fund raising, and by finding sponsors, to develop press releases and media campaigns to generate an awareness of our sport, and to provide outreach to countries that do not yet have organized unicycling. In essence, the Public Relations Committee embodies the aims of our organization, and its job is by far the largest of all. This is the job of each and every IUF and USA member; to help our sport grow.

"Sport" does not just mean unicycle competition; it refers to the "activity" of riding unicycles, whether they be used to race, to perform in a circus, as part of a physical education program, or just to ride down the street for fun. Most people are totally unaware of unicycling as an organized activity. The USA and IUF are not well known. Many major unicycle manufacturers and cycling organizations don't even know we exist. Of course, they should. If people want to find out more about unicycling, before or after they buy one, there should be someplace they can turn. If they don't know our organizations exist, they can't look us up!

To revitalize the Public Relations Committee, I need people who are interested in contacting bicycle companies, cycling and circus organizations, and large corporations. I'm looking for people who would like to see stories about unicycling on national T.V. or read about it in major magazines or newspapers. I'm looking for people who have background in the communications arts or who, like myself, are using this experience for self-education. Due to previous commitments (such as this newsletter), I don't plan to run this

committee, but to help set it up and offer guidance. A strong Public Relations Committee will improve unicycling for everybody everywhere, not just the IUF! Contact me at:
